If a picture is worth a thousand words..... then imagine what this presentation is worth.

No, don't bother. They told me there would be no math involved.....

In 1895 Arthur Conan Doyle tired of writing Sherlock Holmes stories so in "The Final Problem" Holmes and his arch enemy Professor Moriarty plunged to their death at the Reichenbach Falls near the village of Meiringan, Switzerland (or did they?)

Doyle eventually had to give in to the public and private demands for more stories about the world's first consulting detective. When "The Hound of the Baskervilles" was first serialized in *The* Strand Magazine (April 1901) it was explained that the events took place prior to the incident at Reichenbach Falls. The world's first prequel.

Eventually, Holmes was brought back from the dead in "The Empty House' but that's a story for another time.

Since *The Hound of the Baskervilles* was published in book form in 1902, it has never been out of prints and is the most popular of all of the Sherlock Holmes stories. I hope to present here tonight a slight insight into the world of Foreign Translations of



Arguably one of the most famous literary characters of all time, Sherlock Holmes has appeared in numerous forms of media since his inception in 1887. With the recent growth of on-screen adaptations in both film and serial television forms, there is much new material to be analyzed and discussed. However, recent adaptations have begun exploring new reimaginings of Holmes, discarding his beginnings as the Victorian Gentleman Detective to create a much more flawed and multi-faceted character. Using Sir Arthur Conan Doyle's original work as a reference point, this study explores how recent adaptors use both Holmes's diegetic violin performance and extra-diegetic music. Not only does music in these screen adaptations take the role of narrative agent, it moreover serves to place the character of Holmes into the Romantic Genius archetype.

A SCANDAL IN BOHEMIA

To Sherlock Holmes she is always the woman. I have seldom heard him mention her under any other name. In his eyes she eclipses and predominates the whole of her sex. It was not that he felt any emotion akin to love for Irene Adler. All emotions, and that one particularly, were abhorrent to his cold, precise but admirably balanced mind. He was, I take it, the most perfect reasoning and observing machine that the world has seen, but as a lover he would have placed himself in a false position. He never spoke of the softer passions, save with a gibe and a sneer. They were admirable things for the observer -excellent for drawing the veil from men's motives and actions. But for the trained reasoner to admit such intrusions into his own delicate and finely adjusted temperament was to introduce a distracting factor which might throw a doubt upon all his mental results. Grit in a sensitive instrument, or a crack in one of his own high-power lenses, would not be more disturbing than a strong emotion in a nature such as his. And yet there was but one woman to him, and that woman was the late Irene Adler, of dubious and questionable memory.

I had seen little of Holmes lately. My marriage had drifted us away from each other. My own complete happiness, and the home-centred interests which rise up around the man who first finds himself master of his own establishment, were sufficient to absorb all my attention, while Holmes, who loathed every form of society with his whole Bohemian soul, remained in our lodgings in Baker Street, buried among his old books, and alternating from week to week between cocaine and ambition, the drowsiness of the drug, and the fierce energy of his own keen nature.


