

"The Adventures of Sherlock Holmes"

I arrived a bit early and was treated, along with everyone else, to live jazz trumpet music.

his play is divided into 2 acts with 2 parts to each act. Each part is a Canonical story. The Adventure of the Blue Carbuncle, The Advenyre of the Five Orange Pips, The Adventure of the Devil's Foot, and The Adventure of the Copper Beeches are the each solved by our hero or should I say once again our HERo. Sherlock Holmes (Summer Brinley) fills the role of Holmes with confidence and charm. Dr. Watson(s) (Tucker Dowler- Act 1, part 1/ Act 2 part 1; Karen Goins- Act 1, part 2/ Act 2 part 2) were equally effective and the audience did not care if Watson was played by a male or female. One thing the audience did care for were the violin interludes by Ian Goins. He played in between scenes and at intermission. It was a beautiful touch.

he rest of the cast members filled in the many roles required for the 4 separate mysteries. Tyler Berg (Mr. Rucastle; John's father), Brittany Connelly (Little man; Mrs. Rucastle), Alex Johnson (Peterson; Vicar) Jackson Applegate (Henry Baker; Mortimer; Mr. Stopes) and Raylee Woodward (Violet; Land Lady). When not Watsoning, Mr. Dowler and Ms. Goins also played other roles. I know I am missing others but everyone desires the tip of the deerstalker for a fine production. Sadly, Sunday, November 19 is the final performance. The 1930's building was donated to the Grant County Community Theatre. This small operation produced a grand production. Hopefully, there will be more Holmes in their future.
